This concert marks the first appearance of Sharon B. Hoose as conductor of the Municipal Band of Charlottesville. Mr. Hoose is not new to Charlottesville audiences, for, during the past 16 years, he has directed the Lane High Band, which has achieved state and national recognition for its musical excellence. In addition, he is Supervisor of Instrumental Music for the public schools of the city.



Mr. Hoose was born in Atlanta, Illinois. He attended Illinois Wesleyan University School of Music, where he received a Bachelor of Music degree in June 1935. He received a Master of Music Education degree from the same school in 1952. Mr. Hoose majored on euphonium and trombone, and was a member of and soloist with the Charlottesville Municipal Band from 1941 to 1951.

Before coming to Charlottesville, Mr. Hoose was Director of Music for the public schools in Buffalo, Kansas, for one year; and Director of Bands at Randolph-Macon Academy and Warren County High School at Front Royal, Virginia, for 5 years.

He is past-president of both the Virginia Music Educators Association and the Virginia Band and Orchestra Directors Association. He was elected to, and his biography appears in *Who's Who in Music*. He is a member of Phi Mu Alpha, National Honorary Music Fraternity, and of Phi Kappa Phi, National Honorary Scholastic Fraternity.

The public is invited to attend the series of outdoor concerts to be played by the band this summer. Newspaper and radio will announce dates and locations.
